# Lucian GREK 1111A [CRN: 25024]

## Overview

The funniest and most impressive writer of Greek prose during the imperial period (not to mention the alleged inventor of science fiction), it is no wonder that Lucian was a favorite author from the Renaissance to the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Beloved of great thinkers like Thomas More and Jonathan Swift, even Martin Luther had this to say to his rival Erasmus: "you ooze Lucian from every pore..." Lucian has every right to experiencing a much-deserved revival and becoming again a central author of the classical canon -- as he had been through most of history. We will read some of his best texts, appreciate their Greek, and consider the context in which they were written.
